- You have the right to request and receive supportive measures.

What You Need to Know


- All Employees of the University are considered Mandatory Reporters.



Bystander Intervention

- Safety First: Ask yourself if it is safe to intervene, If the situation is already violent or looks like it may escalate quickly, don't directly intervene. Call 911.
- Three ways in which you can intervene:
 - Distract
 - Direct
 - **Delegate**
