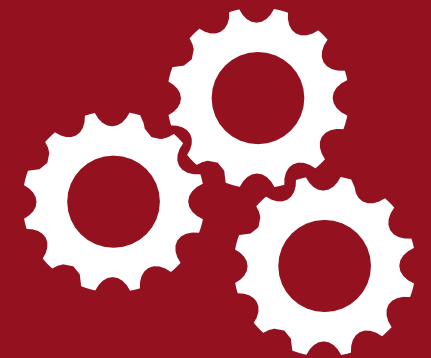

1. Go to <https://givepul.se/pa6ckz> and log in with your UIW credentials

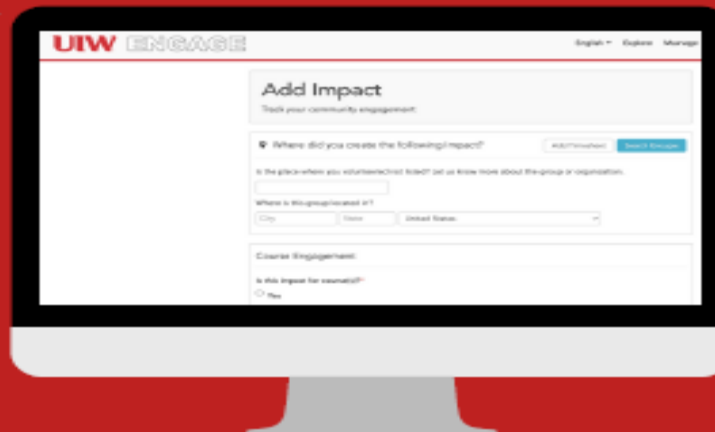

2. Scroll down and click the **"Add Impact"** button

3. You can change the place of impact if you did not serve with UIW by clicking the **"Change"** button at the top of the form. It will give you a list to choose from or you can click the **"Can't find it?"** button which will allow you to type in a name and contact information.

4. Fill out the date, the amount of hours served, and answer the questions, as well as provide additional feedback or upload documents.
