Exchange Application Information

Nomination

Before applying, students interested in doing an exchange at UIDE should contact their international office. The exchange coordinator then sends an email to UIDE nominating the student for an exchange.

Nomination period:

Spring Semester 2023: September 5th - October 31st 2022

Fall Semester 2023: March 6th - April 15th 2023

Application

Once the nomination is accepted by UIDE, the student completes the online application form and uploads the requested documents.

Application deadline:

Spring Semester 2023: November 31st 2022

Fall Semester 2023: August 15th 2023





Admissions requirements for exchange students

- Two semesters of university completed

- Minimum GPA of 2.8/4.0 or 80/100

- Spanish proficiency: minimum Level B1 is strongly recommended

- English proficiency is recommended for those students who take courses only in English

- International health insurance

Application documents

- Approval form with the list of courses you plan to take at UIDE
- Learning Agreement approved by home university
- Accommodation Plan
- Medical Form
- University transcript
- Application form
- A copy of passport

Health insurance requirements

All exchange students are required to have health insurance valid for the duration of their stay.

Visa

To stay in Ecuador for more than 90 days, students need a visa. Semester/year exchange students need to apply for a Temporary Residence - Student Visa

International Student Life

Airport pickup

Either a university representative or a **student's** host family will pick up the student at the airport on arrival in Ecuador.

Accommodation

Exchange students can choose to live with an Ecuadorian host family or find housing on their own. The exchange coordinator is in charge of placing students with host families, which have been vetted by OPII.

Staying with Ecuadorian families is part of the cultural immersion experience and gives students the opportunity to interact with locals and have a safe and comfortable place to live.



International Student Club


The International Student Club connects full-time UIDE students and current international students interested in culture and language exchange. They coordinate night outings and activities around campus and the city for club members.

Costs and Living Expenses

Tuition fees

No academic costs are charged to exchange students from universities with a bilateral agreement. For students from unaffiliated universities, tuition fees vary depending on the length of the exchange and specific classes taken.

Estimated budget

Rent: \$300-\$400 per month in a shared apartment

Food: \$300-\$400 per month (if not staying with a host family)

To have an idea of average everyday costs, we have made the following list:

- 500 ml bottle of water: \$0.50

- Lunch in the UIDE cafeteria: \$3.40 (includes soup, main dish, dessert, juice)

National beer in a store: \$1.50Imported beer in a store: \$3.50

- City bus: \$0.25

- Daytime taxi ride within the city: less than \$5

- Pair of Levi's jeans: \$75-\$100 (imported items are expensive)

- Dinner in a nice restaurant: \$20-\$30
