ADDENDUM I

TWO (2) + TWO (2) ARTICULATION PROGRAMS

UNIVERSITY OF THE INCARNATE WORD (UIW) AND

WUHAN TECHNOLOGY AND BUSINESS UNIVERSITY (WTBU)

1. Purpose of Addendum I

- i. This document serves as an addendum to the existing Sister School Agreement between the University of the Incarnate Word (UIW) and Wuhan Technology and Business University (WTBU). The purpose of this addendum is to formally establish two (2) + two (2) articulation programs between the two institutions allowing students from Wuhan Technology and Business University to transfer to UIW in San Antonio, Texas in order to earn a Bachelor of Business (B.B.A.) with concentrations in Accounting, Finance, International Business, or Marketing.
- ii. Whereas the above named institutions are joined in an agreement of mutual cooperation and recognize that an agreement of cooperation would be of mutual benefit and would serve as a continued interest in implementing two (2) + two (2) programs, it is understood that:
 - Each student involved in this/these program(s) will be subject to the admission requirements and tuition and fees of the host university. Students will be admitted in accordance with the admission requirements for international and exchange students set forth in the university catalogue.
 - 2. Each department will facilitate and assist in the enrollment of qualified undergraduate students.
 - Each department agrees to collaborate in academic research in the spirit and pursuit of academic excellence.

2. Number of Participants

i. The number of participants is not limited; however, each student will be subject to the agreed upon terms and conditions set forth by both parties. Each institution reserves the right to add, change, and/or modify conditions, provided that there is mutual agreement between the parties. Written notice is required within a six month period and shall become effective upon signing the new addendum by both parties. Both parties will add two (2) signed original documents to this existing addendum I.

3. Academic Qualifications

- i. Students will be considered for acceptance into the two (2) + two (2) program based on the requirements set forth in the University of the Incarnate Word's Catalogue for international and exchange students. In addition, students will specifically adhere to the following academic criteria:
 - <u>Language requirement</u>: students will have obtained the following English requirement, before starting year three (3) at the University of the Incarnate Word:
 - TOEFL TOEFL: 550 pbt; 213cbt;79 ibt
 - TOEIC: 650 and above
 - IELTS: 6.5
 - 2. <u>Course requirement</u>: Students will have taken and successfully completed (minimum grade: C; 70% out of 100%) the agreed upon courses, as agreed upon by both parties, before starting year three (3) at the University of the Incarnate Word.

4. Two (2) + Two (2) Programs / Course Requirements

- i. Each party will be required to oversee and guide students in order to adhere to the agreed upon academic degree plan(s) (degree checklist), which detail the required courses to be taken at the home university and host institution. Both parties agree to exchange academic course information, review course content, and mutually confirm the courses that may be transferred to UIW before accepting any student(s) into the program.
- ii. The 2 + 2 Program Articulation Degree Checklist shall be utilized as a guide for students to follow prior to transferring to UIW. UIW representatives including, but not limited to, UIW Registrar, Provost, and Academic Dean(s) of the corresponding school reserve the right to require additional courses that may be needed in order to complete the desired degree program. Both parties shall combine their efforts to offer academic counseling to interested student's in order to ensure students are aware of the required courses and the UIW international application process.
- iii. Two original copies of the degree plan(s) are required to be signed by all parties. Each party will acquire one (1) original copy for their records.
- iv. The attached degree plan to this Addendum I titled "Proposal for Wuhan Technology and Business University (WTBU)", shall serve as a guide and may be modified in the future as both parties continue to review and analyze which courses may be transferred to UIW from WTBU.

5. Financial Responsibilities of Students

i. Students will be fully responsible for tuition and other fees (i.e., Room & Board, student fees, health insurance, etc.) associated with participating in this program.

6. Accommodation

i. Students who will be hosted at the University of the Incarnate Word are required to live on-campus. Students hosted by Wuhan Technology and Business University may not have on-campus accommodations; however, will be assisted in locating and acquiring western style off-campus housing. Students will also be made aware of all the financial responsibilities, such as costs associated with accommodations, including utility accounts and rental deposits.

7. Period of Agreement

i. This Addendum will become effective upon signing by both parties and will be valid until such time that one or both parties decide to terminate the program. Should one of the parties wish to terminate the Addendum I, ((two (2) + two (2) programs)), notice of this should be given in writing at least six (6) months prior to termination. Students who are currently enrolled in the program and attending the University of the Incarnate Word (UIW) shall be allowed to complete the program, provided that they meet the requirements set forth on this addendum I.

8. Notices

- i. Any notice or other communication under this agreement shall be given in writing and delivered by hand, or sent by pre-paid post.
